

Identify Opportunities

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CAQH CORE Voting Process

CAQH CORE Body*	CAQH CORE Requirements for Operating Rules Approval
Level 1: Subgroups & Task Groups	Formal vote is not required, but consensus is assessed via straw polls and must be achieved prior to moving to the next level of voting.
Level 2: Work Groups	Work Groups require for a quorum that 60% of all organizational participants are voting. Simple majority vote (greater than 50%) by this quorum is needed to approve a rule.
Level 3: Full Voting Membership	Full CAQH CORE Voting Membership vote requires for a quorum that 60% of all Full CORE Voting Member organizations (i.e., CAQH CORE Participants that create, transmit, or use transactions) vote on the proposed rule at this stage. With a quorum, a 66.67% approval vote is needed to approve a rule.
Level 4: CAQH CORE Board	The CAQH CORE Board's normal voting procedures would apply. If the Board does not approve any proposed Operating Rule, the Board will issue a memorandum setting forth the reasons it did not approve the proposed Operating Rule and will ask the CORE Subgroups and Work Groups to revisit the proposed Operating Rule.

*NOTES: Neither the CAQH CORE Board nor CAQH has veto or voting power over the CAQH CORE Operating Rules. Any entity that is a CAQH CORE participant per the CAQH CORE application process has a right to vote on the rules, understanding that at Level 3 only entities that will implement the rules vote on the rules.

CAQH CORE Review Work Group: Scope

Scope

The CAQH CORE RWG will further review and refine **both Draft CAQH CORE Attachments Operating Rule Sets** to ensure uniformity and cohesion across the prior authorization and claims use cases. Additionally, the RWG will review updates to the **CAQH CORE Eligibility & Benefits Data Content Rule** and update key requirements included in the existing **CAQH CORE Infrastructure Operating Rules**.

Attachments refer to the exchange of patient-specific medical information or supplemental documentation to support an administrative healthcare transaction and are a bridge between clinical and administrative data.

- Attachments are exchanged electronically, partially electronically, and manually; however, exchanging medical documentation for prior authorization is often highly manual and a source of significant administrative burden.
- A range of standards and specifications currently support the exchange of attachments (e.g., X12 275, HL7 C-CDA, HL7 FHIR, SOAP, REST, etc.)
- A HIPAA-mandated standard for attachments has not been named, resulting in lack of industry direction on a
 uniform approach in the supporting clinical documentation requested by health plans.
- CAQH CORE launched its Attachments Advisory Group in 2019 as an industry collaborative to guide the development of common approaches for the exchange of attachments to reduce administrative burden.
- The Attachments Subgroup launched in July 2020 and drafted requirements based on opportunity areas identified in <u>Attachments White Paper</u> and prioritized by the CAQH CORE Attachments Advisory Group.
- Draft requirements address the Prior Authorization Attachments Use Case and Claims Attachments Use Case.

NOTE: The HHS Unified Agenda announced that an <u>Attachments NPRM</u> may be published in 2021. The NPRM is expected to adopt standards for health care attachments transactions and electronic signature used with the transaction, among other standard and operating rule adoptions.

High Engagement in Attachments Subgroups

Attachments Subgroup – Prior Authorization Use Case

Nearly **150 individuals** from **over 50 unique CAQH CORE Participating Organizations** participated.

The group participated in 6 subgroup calls, 1 feedback form, and 2 straw polls with a 73% average response rate across feedback forms and straw polls.

Resulted in **two draft attachments** rules to be forwarded to the RWG for further review and refinement:




Attachments Subgroup – Claims Use Case

Over **90 individuals** from **nearly 50 unique CAQH CORE Participating Organizations** participated.



The group participated in 3 subgroup calls, 1 feedback form, and 1 straw poll with a 70% average response rate across feedback forms and straw polls.

CAQH CORE Attachments Operating Rules

Scope: Methods to Submit Additional Documentation

While additional exchange methods are emerging within the industry, including the use of HL7 FHIR, the **scope of the Draft CAQH CORE Attachments Operating Rules address the following two scenarios** for sending attachments/additional documentation:

- 1. Using the X12 275: Defined as the use of CORE Connectivity as the payload exchange method + X12 v6020 275 attachment payload format
- 2. Without Using the X12 275: Defined as the use of CORE Connectivity as the payload exchange method without an X12 v6020 275 payload format. In this scenario, the additional information or documentation is contained within the specific payload type.

CAQH CORE Attachments Initiative – Prior Authorization Use Case

Summary of Draft Rule Requirements

Scope: CAQH CORE Prior Authorization Attachment Operating Rule Requirements

Payload Formats include both the X12 275 and Non-X12 275 (HL7 C-CDA, FHIR, .pdf, etc.).



- ✓ Electronic standard method for acknowledging receipt of an X12 v6020X316 275 attachment and maximum response times (Real-time: 20 seconds | Batch: Two business days).
- ✓ **Minimums for document size and amount of data** that must be supported and accepted by systems (64MB).
- ✓ **Standard method and response time** for receiving system to return errors to the provider (X12 v6020 824).
- ✓ **System availability** must be no less than 86% per calendar week; health plans must publish downtimes.
- ✓ Common format and flow of information for implementation of attachment transactions in Companion Guides.



- ✓ **Reassociation** requirements for X12 275 and non-X12 275 payload formats including use of **Code EL**.
- ✓ Consistent reference data between the prior authorization Requests & associated attachment(s).

Benefits: The Draft Prior Authorization Attachment Operating Rules ease the burden of exchanging additional documentation by building on existing CAQH CORE Prior Authorization Rules and CORE Connectivity vC4.0.0.0 to address common hurdles such as how to connect (or reassociate) attachments to the appropriate X12 278 Request and establishing consistency around infrastructure requirements.

CAQH CORE Attachments Initiative – Claims Use Case

Summary of Draft Rule Requirements

Scope: CAQH CORE Claims Attachment Operating Rule Requirements

Payload Formats include both the X12 275 and Non-X12 275 (HL7 C-CDA, FHIR, .pdf, etc.).



- ✓ Builds upon the CAQH CORE Health Care Claims (837) Infrastructure Rule and aligns with the Draft Prior Authorization Attachment Infrastructure Requirements to include support for real-time and batch response time, system availability, and companion guide requirements, etc.
- ✓ Establishes electronic policy access requirements.
- ✓ Specifies **support for multiple electronic attachments** to support a single claim submission.



- ✓ Aligns with the Draft Prior Authorization Attachment Data Content Requirements to include support for specific codes to reassociate X12 275 attachments to X12 837 Claims submissions, including Code EL, and establishes common reference data used to connect X12 and non-X12 attachments with X12 837 Claim submissions.
- ✓ Requires health plans to use appropriate LOINCs to request most specific additional information.

Benefits: The Draft Attachments Claims Operating Rules ease the burden of exchanging additional documentation by establishing key requirements specific to the claims-use case workflow including health plan support for consistent electronic policy access and seamlessly aligning with existing CORE Operating Rules and the Draft Prior Authorization Attachment Operating Rules.

Example: Impact of Draft CAQH CORE Attachments Operating Rules – Improve Workflow





Provider submits unsolicited X12 275 attachment(s) with X12 278 prior authorization (PA) request to the health plan

NOTE: Providers may send the initial X12 278 request without an attachment. See **Step 5b** of this workflow.

- Pain Point: Additional clinical documentation required to complete the prior authorization is not consistently available to providers in an electronic format and/or in a uniform location.
- Draft Requirement (X12 & Non-X12): Health plans must offer an electronic method for identifying attachment-specific data needed to support prior authorization request adjudication.

Health plan receives and acknowledges attachment(s)*

- Pain Point: Lack of clarity among providers as to whether the attachment(s) were received by the health plan.
- Draft Requirement (X12): Real-Time X12 999
 Acknowledgement within 20 seconds & Batch within 2 Business Days.
- Draft Requirement (X12 & Non-X12): Front-end servers must be able to minimally accept files with BDS segments of 64MB or larger to ensure typical attachments can be sent electronically.

Health plan processes attachment

- Pain Points: Health plans often receive attachments they are not able to process or that contain errors. The industry currently does not have a standard method to communicate this information. Additionally, health plans have differing maximum file size capabilities.
- Draft Requirement (X12): Health plans must use the X12 824 transaction to communicate data/processing errors to the provider, allowing for more specificity when providers adjust the submission due to errors.
- Draft Requirement (X12 & Non-X12): Internal Document Management Systems must be able to minimally accept files with 64MB or larger.





Health plan links attachment to PA Request

- Pain Points: Health plans are often unaware an attachment was sent to support a PA request. Additionally, attachments are typically not linked to the original claim submission and do not contain uniform information to assist health plans with linking the attachment to the PA request once both are received.
- Draft Requirement (X12): Providers must use Code EL in Step 1 to notify the health plan at Step 4 that additional documentation is being transmitted electronically. This streamlines health plan ability to link the attachment to the prior authorization request.
- Draft Requirement (Non-X12): Provider should use Common CORE Connectivity Headers when sending non-X12 275 attachments to assist health plans with reassociation.
- Draft Requirement (X12 & Non-X12):
 Providers should include Common
 Reference Data on the attachment to assist health plans with identification and reassociation.





Fully adjudicated PA - workflow complete

Health plan requests additional information to adjudicate the PA request

- Pain Point: Providers are often not informed of the specific information required to adjudicate the PA.
- **NOTE**: Process repeats at **Step 1** with providers sending **solicited** attachment(s).
- Draft Requirement (X12): Use of appropriate LOINCs to request additional information when using the X12 277 RFAI so providers can respond with necessary clinical information.

^{*}Receipt and acknowledgement of the X12 278 is addressed in existing CAQH CORE 278 Prior Authorization Infrastructure Rule & aligns with this draft requirement.

Key Takeaways



Key Takeaways

- The Draft CAQH CORE Attachments Operating Rule requirements target key infrastructure requirements, exchange standards, and one of the most significant problem areas in the attachment's workflow process: reassociation of an attachment to the original PA request or claim submission.
- These enhancements reduce the unnecessary back and forth between providers and health plans and enable shorter adjudication timeframes and reduced staff resources spent on manual follow-up.
- The rule requirements reduce barriers to adoption by:
 - Strengthening the data submitted by the provider to inform the health plan an attachment has been sent electronically.
 - Providing additional guidance to communicate data and processing errors, allowing for more specificity when providers adjust the submission due to errors.
 - Establishing key infrastructure requirements that align with existing CAQH CORE Infrastructure Rules and provide the information necessary to electronically send attachments uniformly and consistently.



CAQH CORE Eligibility & Benefits Data Content Rule Update

CAQH CORE Eligibility & Benefits Data Content Rule

Overview of Existing Rule Requirements

The CAQH CORE Eligibility & Benefits Data Content Rule requires the submission and return of certain uniform data elements in real time for electronic eligibility, coverage, and benefit transactions.

- Support requests for benefit information at least 12 months into the past and up to the end of the current month.
- Inclusion of the following in response to both generic and explicit inquires:
 - Name of the health plan covering the individual.
 - Patient financials for co-insurance, co-payment, and base and remaining deductibles.
 - If financial responsibility is different for **in-network** vs. **out-of-network**, both amounts must be returned.
- Return of CORE-required eligibility & benefits data for 51 specific Service Type Codes.
- Requires health plans and providers to uniquely identify patients (subscribers, members, beneficiaries) for the purpose of ascertaining the eligibility of the patient for health plan benefits via last name normalization
- Defines a standard way for health plans to report errors in the event they are not able to respond to a provider with eligibility information for the requested patient or subscriber through AAA error code reporting requirements.
- Vendors must be able to detect and extract all data elements to which the data content rule applies as returned by the health plan in the X12 271 response.



CAQH CORE Eligibility & Benefits Data Content Rule UpdateScope

The **Draft CAQH CORE Eligibility & Benefits Data Content Rule Update** enhances the exchange of eligibility information between health plans and providers through requirements including providing financial information, especially co-insurance, co-payment, deductible, remaining deductible amounts, and coverage information for a set of service types in real time.

- In Fall 2020, CAQH CORE participants identified the eligibility and benefits business process as an area for CAQH CORE to prioritize for operating rule development in 2021 given evolving business needs since rule was first developed.
- In Spring 2021, CAQH CORE launched a Task Group to evaluate opportunity areas for operating rule enhancement for the CAQH CORE Eligibility & Benefits Data Content Rule. The Task Group evaluated numerous opportunity areas and drafted operating rules for the following areas:
 - 1. **Telemedicine**: Address the emergent need to communicate telemedicine-specific eligibility and benefit information
 - 2. Service Type Codes: Include adding additional SCT Codes beyond the current 52 CORE-required STC codes
 - 3. Remaining Coverage Benefits: Support the communication of the number of remaining visits/services left on a benefit
 - 4. Procedure Codes: Ability to respond to eligibility and benefit requests at the procedure level (e.g., CPT, HCPCS)
 - **5. Prior Authorization/Certification:** Ability to communicate if prior authorization/certification is required for a specific procedure or service
 - 6. Tiered Benefits: Provision of more granular level data for members of tiered benefit plans



Updates to CAQH CORE Infrastructure Operating Rules

Enhancements to Existing CAQH CORE Infrastructure Rules

Each set of CAQH CORE Operating Rules includes an infrastructure rule with requirements for processing mode, response time, system availability, connectivity, acknowledgements, and companion guides, by transaction.

- In response to feedback from CAQH CORE Participants and the CAQH CORE Board, the RWG will also address updates to the existing CAQH CORE Infrastructure Operating Rule requirements across all rule sets to align with evolving business needs and technology.
- CAQH CORE is launching a brief Infrastructure Operating Rules Update Survey Wednesday
 <u>09/01/21</u> to further inform the scope of this work by gathering feedback from CAQH CORE Participating
 Organizations on updates to the system availability and response time requirements across all CAQH
 CORE Infrastructure Rules.
- This RWG will review the results of the survey and agree on specific adjustments as the first step in the formal CAQH CORE rule development and maintenance process.
- The RWG may also consider changes to the infrastructure requirements beyond the areas included in the survey.
