 Ms. Powers provided a level set of the call, focusing on the next steps in the process, which include the RWG Ballot (October 27-November 7), the All-CORE Vote (November 10-21), and the CORE Board Vote. 	<u>Discussion</u>	
3. Tyler Sheid, AMA, gave an overview of Straw Poll #1.	<u>Discussion</u>	
Over two-thirds of organizations submitted Straw Poll #1 responses.		
 Submissions showed strong representation across the industry: 28% providers, 		
28% vendors, 24% health plans, 12% SDOs, and 8% government.		
 Eight of nine rule sections received at least 80% support, and two items reached one hundred percent. The primary area for improvement is the Data Alignment Requirements section, which received 64% support and 36% opposition. On Technical Requirements, 82% supported the draft language, while 18% did not, indicating minor revisions but overall approval. 		
Mr. Scheid and Kristin Thonsgaard, Optum, reviewed the substantive comments and	Discussion	
points of clarification received on each section of Straw Poll #1. Based on the feedback		
and discussion, the following changes were recommended to the Draft Claim Status		
Data Content Rule:		
All Sections: Remove Loop NM109 from 2100E for Subscriber ID.		
Section 3: Scope and Section 4: Technical Requirements: Allow the Provider		
Type to be Billing or Rendering. Recommend using the same provider from the claim file.		
Section 4.2: Association and Alignment of Returned Status to Claim Line: update Section 4.2.4: Identifier Consistency language from shall to should so that the following paragraph reads: All entities should maintain consistency of persistent identifiers across subsequent X12 v5010 277 responses for the same claim, including, at a minimum, the Patient Control Number and the Payer Claim Control Number, to preserve a stable association over time.		
 Section 4.3: Data Alignment Requirements: Require the use of either the Payer Claim Control Number or Patient Control Number, or both, if both are available. Make Patient Name a recommended data element. Remove Name Normalization. Other non-substantive changes will be included in the updated draft based on non-substantive comments received, which can be reviewed in Document #2. 		
Ms. Thonsgaard provided an overview of the RWG Ballot	Action Required	
 The RWG Ballot will be open from Monday, October 27th, to Friday, November 7th, allowing RWG Participating Organizations two weeks to submit their response. 	Agreed to next steps.	
The ballot requires 60% of RWG organizations to vote, and a simple majority		
support level is required for each draft rule section.
